#7—Share dyes amongst groups of students.

#8-2 students can share 1 beeswax.

#9—Pick up your order in person at our many kiosk locations to avoid shipping costs.

#10—Limit the number of colors used.

#11—Start with small groups and accumulate additional tools over time until you have a full class set.

#12—The more pysanky you make, the more cost effective they become!




